#### Selection Process Regulations for the Bachelor's program in International Management

#### Amended version

Adopted by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Business Management and Social Sciences on October 5, 2016, approved by the University Steering Committee on May 10, 2017, published on May 30, 2017

### Section 1 Selection Process

<sup>1</sup>In the university's selection process, 90 out of 100 places are awarded after deducting priority quotas; the remaining places are allocated on the basis of waiting times. <sup>2</sup>This selection is 100% based on the candidate's special aptitude for the Bachelor's program in combination with the average grade.

# Section 2 Participation in the Process

The selection process is only open to candidates who

- a) have applied for a place in the correct form and within the period prescribed, and
- b) do not participate in the allocation procedure as part of a quota to be deducted beforehand in accordance with the Higher Education Allocation Ordinance (*Hochschulvergabeverordnung* HVVO) or
- c) have not been allocated a place in the basis of their waiting time.

# Section 3 Criteria for Special Aptitude

- (1) <sup>1</sup>Special aptitude for the Bachelor's program is determined on the basis of relevant vocational training, as well as a stay abroad. <sup>2</sup>Special aptitude improves the average grade of the candidate's university entrance qualification in accordance with paragraph 2.
- (2) The average grade of the candidate's university entrance qualification is improved by
  - 0.3 on presentation of proof of relevant vocational training with a grade of 2.5 or higher,
  - 0.2 on presentation of proof of an uninterrupted stay abroad of at least six months.

## Section 4 Entry into Force

<sup>1</sup>These regulations shall enter into force after their publication in the Official Gazette of Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences with effect from the winter semester 2017/2018. <sup>2</sup>The Selection Process Regulations of August 31, 2010 for this degree program will expire at the same time.
