

Regulations Governing Proof of Additional Admission Requirements for the Bachelor's program in Physiotherapy

Adopted by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Business Management and Social Sciences on December 4, 2024, approved by the University Steering Committee on December 11, 2024, approved by the Foundation Board on December 19, 2024, published on January 24, 2025 with effect from March 1, 2025

Section 1 Additional Admission Requirements

- (1) ¹The requirement for admission to the international Bachelor's program in Physiotherapy is the successful completion of vocational training (state-approved examination) in physiotherapy at a technical high school.
- (2) ¹Alternatively, applicants who have obtained 90 ECTS credit points for graded and ungraded exams at a foreign university, which do not differ significantly from the skills and competences to be acquired during training to become a state-certified physiotherapist, will be admitted to the program. ²Applicants must demonstrate that they have earned the following number of credit points following the acquisition of skills in the field of physiotherapy:
 - Subject-specific competence (a minimum of 20 ECTS)
 - Methodological skills (a minimum of 20 ECTS)
 - Social skills (a minimum of 15 ECTS)
 - People skills (a minimum of 15 ECTS)

³In particular, the following foreign modules meet the requirements of sentence 2:

- For subject-specific competence: Physical therapy in Clinical Specialties; Issues for elective subjects: Advance clinical assessment by ultrasound imaging; Medical and Surgical Conditions and their Treatments; Biomechanics and Kinesiology; Virtual Reality and Rehabilitation; Neuroscience; Manipulative Therapy; Pathophysiology for Physical Therapy
- For methodological skills: Introduction to Research Methodology; Specific Methods in Physical therapy I and Simulation; Manual Therapy; Biostatistics; Imaging Methods; Research in Health Science for Physical Therapy; Human Biomechanics
- For social skills: Biopsychosocial Care in Physical therapy; Public Health and Legislation in Physical therapy; Physiotherapy Profession and Ethics; Healthy Living and Exercise; Physical Therapy in Community; Physical Therapy in Special Conditions
- For people skills: Communication, Interpersonal Skills and Simulation; Values Education; Medical English for Physiotherapy; Job Coaching: Place, Train, Maintain; Healthy with Integrative Medicine

§ 2 Foreign Language Skills

¹Applicants must be able to demonstrate an adequate level of English, at least at level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). ²Proof shall be provided by submitting a certificate or by passing a language proficiency test by the start of the lecture period at the latest

Section 3 Entry into Force

¹These regulations shall enter into force after their publication in the Official Gazette of Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences with effect from the beginning of the application period for the summer semester 2025.
